The American Association for Justice (AAJ), formerly known as the Association of Trial Lawyers of America (ATLA®), is steadfastly fighting to ensure that medical malpractice reform does not creep into the comprehensive health care legislation being voted upon by Congress this term.

Also on its legislative agenda for the upcoming year are the Medical Device Safety Act (which would overrule *Riegel v. Medtronic*), several bills that would disallow forced arbitration in certain types of contracts such as employment and many consumer agreements, legislation to restore notice pleading in federal court, and provisions to amend the tax code to allow expenses to be deducted in the year they are accrued instead of when the case is settled or decided.

One of the most important areas that AAJ has made significant strides in is the area of preemption – combating the detrimental effect that preemption has on our civil justice system. In order to continue to fight preemption and tort reform nationwide, it's imperative that we support AAJ through our membership. AAJ is the sole entity fighting federal tort reform legislation and AAJ allows our clients to continue to have their day in court and constitutional right to a jury. AAJ cannot continue these efforts without our financial support and
